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## THE ADMINISTRATOR

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Welcome to the 2017/18 Annual Report in which we would like to share with you the accomplishments of the past season and acknowledge the hard work and dedication of our volunteers. You will find details on our lifesaving services, membership, junior activities, financial summaries, sponsorship support and more. Our membership numbers reduced slightly this season down to 191 from 200 and nippers down to 65 from 74.

Improvements that began over the past few seasons continue to flourish and in the not too distant future we should see our kiosk and outdoor area completed. The Building Committee continues to meet regularly and is pivotal in driving these improvements.

Our nippers were once again very lucky to be the recipients of another generous donation of \$4,000 from the Maritime Lodge No. 1. This enabled us to purchase an excellent brand new board trailer.

This season we welcomed Phillip Flynn to the position of Captain of Competition and saw him reinvigorate senior competition which was fantastic, just what the Club needed.

The season ahead will see new challenges as management reshuffles to allow opportunities for new members to step up and take on the call to lead and endeavour to grow our Club in all aspects. A huge thank you to our Management Committee for their efforts and dedication and best of luck to the new management team.

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## THE TREASURER

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This year has been another busy year with a lot of things happening around the Club.

We made a gross profit of \$184,274 due to another payment from the Patty Critchley Estate. This is an ongoing situation that Elaine Farmer is still dealing with in partnership with the Catholic Church and a lawyer. We received \$74,099 from the estate this financial year. The total expenses for the year were \$123,681 leaving a net profit of \$65,153. Compared to last year which was \$35,844. However it should be noted that this is for a 13 month period compared to last year, which was 11 months.

This brings us back in line with our normal financial year so very difficult for an exact comparison.

We have been able to save on our utilities now that the solar system and battery backup have come into full use. All of our air conditioners in the hall and kitchen were in dire need of repairs and the gym air conditioner gave up as well. Nick Sciancalepore installed a new reverse cycle air conditioner in the gym and repaired all the other conditioners.

Other visual things have also been happening at the Club with the removal of the fencing and the sale of the large water tanks. There will be new smaller rain water tanks installed in the coming months.

The bar and kitchen turnover is down a little from last year however last year we did have a very big turnover from the 50 Year Reunion which contributed to the overall takings. The bar made a profit of \$14,546 for the financial year. The kitchen made a loss of \$6,763 against last year's loss of \$3,485. So overall we are still making a profit and keeping the Club open every Friday night has paid off with a more social atmosphere. We have also attracted a few more locals which gives us more of a community feel.



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
**2017-18 Financial Statement Opinion**

In November we started employing kitchen staff and offered meal service every Friday night and if you have eaten at the Club any Friday night I am sure that you were well satisfied with your meal, and your service, because our staff have done a great job.

To try and ease the burden on patrolling members, and to make rosters a far easier thing to deal with for shift workers, Troy Jamieson, Brett Nankervis and I devised a new system which appears to have worked extremely well; and I thank everyone for accepting this trial in the way that they did. It was pleasing to see that not one penalty patrol had to be awarded for non-attendance.

I continue to work with the LeFevre Parish and our legal firm regarding the Patty Critchley Estate. To date the Club has received a substantial amount of funds from the Estate and we will be forever indebted to Patty's generosity.

We introduced a regular Friday night Members' draw this year which appeared to work well and we may look to reintroduce it next summer, subject to the feedback we get at the AGM.

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## LIFESAVING

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The 2017/18 season started fairly casually for me until I attended the AGM and no one was standing to replace Ben Harris as the Captain of Lifesaving. After hearing that someone had put their hand up for Captain of Patrols (Tina Renfrey) and someone else to input the patrol data into SurfGuard Sandra O'Sullivan), I thought why not help out and commit to the role I had previously held for a number of years in the past.

Tina had the daunting task of picking patrol groups, allocating dates and then setting up SurfGuard for easy data entries as the season progressed. Unfortunately, a few people let her down early and the job proved a little much with the heavy workload she already had, and as a result she had to regrettably stand down. So, I then took on the role for the remainder of the season.

Once again Elaine Farmer volunteered her time to coordinate the proficiencies for this season. It is a massive job and takes up a huge amount of personal time making sure everyone is put through their paces for the upcoming season. Unfortunately Elaine had to undergo surgery in early December therefore keeping her off the beach for a couple of months. I continued her hard work by conducting a number of proficiencies in her absence, which made me appreciate the work she does each year. Hopefully, in future she can book surgeries for winter time only.

After realising several valued members were unable to commit to full time patrolling, Elaine Farmer and Troy Jamieson were brain storming ideas on how we can make patrolling less daunting, more attractive to shift workers, the self-employed, travellers etc. And to also fix problems we have had in the past of getting members to actually turn up on their rostered dates. This is where we sat down and came up with a new patrolling system where members could choose their own dates that fit in around work rosters, social, family and other commitments. By introducing this method and taking into consideration the members we had signed up at the time this meant everyone only had to commit to a minimum of five patrols for the year instead of the previous year's being around 10. This proved to be a real positive step forward which saw members who couldn't or didn't want to commit for the season actually sign up and patrol, resulting in a patrol base of 52 members. As we are the only Club in Australia (don't quote me on that) that has such a system in place there was definitely going to be teething issues but I believe for the better part it was a success. With a few minor improvements we will look to continue this system moving forward.

The season was a massive success with us being involved in a number of rescues/assists and countless preventative actions and saw our beach being once again one of the safest to visit in South Australia. This success was demonstrated during the three patrol inspections ran by SLSSA where we lost only 45 points in total. We are still awaiting results to be published but using previous years as a guide this would put us right up above most Clubs across the State. As a Club we contributed a combined effort of 1602.75 hours which is an average of 30.82 hours per member. Quite a few members fell below average so if we can all pick up a couple more hours the average will drop and as a result the load will lighten significantly for everyone.



This season Peter Jamieson won the most patrol hours on 181.75 followed ever so closely by Brett Nankervis (88 hours), James Renfrey (84.75) and Ryan Davis (83.5).

This takes a huge amount of work but with the help of James Renfrey, Deklan Soeroes, Elaine Farmer, Peter Jamieson and me we were able to assist Ryan with making this happen. 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## JUNIORS

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Another season over! We saw lots of new nippers this year as well as returning members. A few were recruited from the Port Adelaide Enfield Council program, Growing for Gold (run by Ryan Davis), as well as from Vacswim.

We had a large group of under 6/7s who didn't seem to mind the cooler conditions. Amy Lawrence and Trish Voigt did a fantastic job keeping them all under control and occupied.

Numbers were slightly down on last year at 65; smaller numbers with the older kids, but six of them completed their Surf Rescue Certificate over the holidays with an assessor coming down in January. These under 14s then helped out as water cover at Nippers as well as fulfilling our quota at carnivals which was fantastic, so the job could be shared. Lots of parent helped as well as asking all parents who were Bronzies to wear their uniform each week and act as water cover which was severely lacking last year. Great to see! We tried to do swims each week to build up confidence and stamina and get through what was required for participation and carnival entries.

Branch carnivals were trialled this year with us being in the western branch with Semaphore, Henley Beach, Grange and West Beach. It was a great concept to try to involve all age groups and retain older kids who don't want to do senior competition. Andrew and Tina Renfrey took a couple of kids down to Henley on January 14<sup>th</sup> and came away with some great ideas. We didn't attend the others or the finale that was held at South Port with the top ten kids chosen from each branch.

There were only three carnivals on the calendar this season of which we attended the first and the last as the second one clashed with the Long Swim through Port Adelaide where we had "all hands on deck". The last carnival before the State Championships was held at Normanville which we turned into our Club camp as our calendar was already so full. Fun times were had by all, adults and kids! This was an opportunity for those nippers who wanted to compete in the State Championships to get a carnival in as the ruling has now been changed, requiring all nippers to have competed in at least one carnival.

Amy Lawrence completed her online official course the week before, so many thanks to her as she fulfilled our obligations for the carnival. Points are now also being awarded for composite teams in carnivals and the State Championships. Under 8s were also added into competition this year. Nine of our nippers entered the States. U8 Bella Jackson; U9 Tahlia Voigt; Mackenzie Overall, Reuben Pattie; U10 Kai Renfrey, Hunter Davis, Jonny Poulton; U11 Spencer Wood and U12 Nicholas Scoffield.

Bella and Spencer both qualified in sprints and flags and Spencer came third in flags which was our first nipper medal for many years (see photo on right). Well done Spencer!

Junior Club Champs were held on February 17<sup>th</sup>. Not the best weather so we headed straight down to the beach. The written quiz was contested two weeks later as a lot left straight after heading off the beach. Age Group Champions were decided taking into account results on the day, attendance at nipper sessions and good sportsmanship.

Andrew gained his bronze medallion in December 1994 and since then has achieved further awards including his Advanced Resuscitation Certificate, IRB crew and IRB driver.

Andrew spent six years as our Swim Captain, four years as Club Administrator and two years as Club Treasurer. The role of Club Treasurer required an enormous amount of work as the accounts were handed over in disarray.

He has always been involved in Club events and has won the President's Trophy for Club Swims twice, the Fastest Club Swim Time on eight occasions, been in the Bernie Loftus Boat Crew once, the Casey Cooper winning team seven times and the Farmer Henderson twice.

When able to he has always made himself available for water cover outside normal patrol hours.

Andrew has completed 22 years of patrol service amassing 1327.75 patrol hours. In 1995/96 he won the Most Patrol Hours award. He has done more than 100 patrol hours in a single season on 3 occasions and is one of only 3 people to have ever done 100+ patrol hours in his first season.


In 2004/05 he was in our Most Efficient Patrol and in 94/95 was awarded Best New Club Member.

New to the Building Committee this year were Don Henderson and Tom Overall with Marilyn Poulton as a frequent visitor, in her role as Club Treasurer.

The work of the Building Committee over this past 12 months has increased substantially and we are confident that our kiosk will be up and running for the start of next summer. You can already see what almost doubling the size of our lawn has done, and the kiosk and surrounds will just amplify what a great community gathering place we hope it will be.

Very soon after the election we met with new Minister (Stephan Knoll) on site about dredging, the coastal pathway, tourism, and making North Haven a community centre because we believe the introduction of the kiosk and its surrounds should go a long way towards establishing our Club as a community hub. We are also hoping that the increased visitation will substantially improve our income raising capacity.

We were fortunate in receiving a \$17,500 grant from the Federal Government towards the outfitting of the kiosk.

We now have a much bigger lawn area with a new watering system, thanks to all the work from Brendan Searle and a few others who helped to lay the new lawn. A lot of other things have also been in the pipeline with the new kiosk getting closer to a reality. Unfortunately, the bureaucratic processes have taken a little longer than we anticipated but we are not far off and it should be well and truly in operation before the start of this summer.

A bee working was organised by Glen Gallagher with quite a few members of the Air Force coming along for a day and installing a volleyball court; weeding; re-organising our gym lay out; planting new native vegetation and reinstalling some of our playground equipment.

Don Henderson and Elaine Farmer have been given the task of improving our entry foyer with a Hall of Fame and a Wall of Fame. This should be finished in the next few months, so keep your eyes open.

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## SOUTH AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S HONOUR ROLL

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
