SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Financial reporting framework

The Trust is not a reporting entity because in the opinion of the Board of Trustees there are unlikely to exist users of the financial report who are unable to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. Accordingly, this 'special purpose financial report' has been prepared to satisfy the information needs of the Board of Trustees.

Basis of Preparation

The financial report has been prepared on the basis of historical cost, unless otherwise indicated. Cost is based on fair values of the consideration given in exchange for assets. All amounts are presented in Australian dollars, unless otherwise noted.

Significant accounting policies

The Board has prepared the financial report in accordance with the following applicable Australian Accounting Standards and UIG Interpretations.

Cash and Cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and cash with banks.

Property

Property has arisen in the Trust as a result of bequests and donations. It is recognised at the Market Value on the vesting date of the bequest or donation to the Trust. These properties have not been revalued since the vesting date as the committee as not seen any revaluation as necessary.

Payables

Trade payables and other accounts payable are recognised when the entity becomes obliged to make future payments resulting from the purchase of goods and services.

Goods and services tax

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST)

Income Tax

The fund has a Tax exempt status.

Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables are recorded at amounts due less any allowance for doubtful debts.

Revenue recognition

Interest income & Distributions

Interest income and Distributions are recognised as they accrue.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REVIEW REPORT

To the Trustees of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide Charitable Trust

Report on the Financial Report

I have reviewed the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report of Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide Charitable Trust, which comprises the Statement of Financial Position, Statement of Comprehensive Income, Statement of Cash flows, Changes in Equity, Notes to the Accounts and the Responsible Persons Declaration for the year ended the 31st December 2021.

Responsible Entities' Responsibility for the Financial Report

The responsible entities (the Trustees) of the registered entity (Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide Charitable Trust) are responsible for the preparation of the financial report that gives a true and fair view and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1 to the financial report is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 (ACNC Act) and the needs of the Trustees. I have conducted my review in accordance with Auditing Standard on Review Engagements ASRE 2415 Review of a Financial Report: Company Limited by Guarantee or an Entity Reporting under the ACNC Act or Other Applicable Legislation or Regulation, in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, anything has come to my attention that causes me to believe that the financial report does not satisfy the requirements of Division 60 of the ACNC Act including: giving a true and fair view of the registered entity's financial position as at 31st December 2021 and its performance for the year ended on that date; and complying with the Australian Accounting Standards and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013 (ACNC Regulation) to the extent noted in note 1 to the accounts. ASRE 2415 requires that I comply with the ethical requirements relevant to the review of the financial report.

A review of a financial report consists of making enquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards and consequently does not enable me to obtain assurance that I would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, I do not express an audit opinion on the attached financial report.

Independence

I am independent of the registered entity in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code). I have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

Reviewers Conclusion

Based on my review, which is not an audit, nothing has come to my attention that causes me to believe that the financial report of Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide Charitable Trust does not satisfy the requirements of Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012 including:

- (a) giving a true and fair view of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Adelaide Charitable Trusts financial position as at 31st December 2021 and of its financial performance for the year ended on that date; and
- (b) complying with Australian Accounting Standards to the extent described in Note 1, and Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013.



Basis of Accounting

Without modifying my conclusion, I draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the responsible entities' financial reporting responsibilities under the ACNC Act. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.
